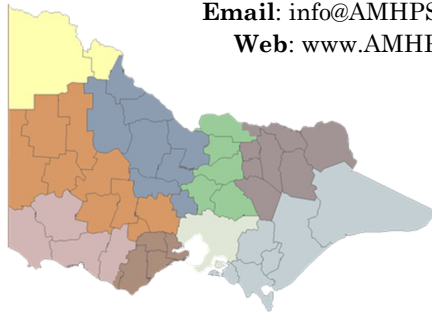

## About us ....

Over the past few years, the number of consumer/peer workers within the mental health sector has grown significantly. Peer/consumer workers are now working in a wide range of services from consumer consultants to research and policy development to community mental health support/outreach roles.

A group of peer workers have been meeting regularly in open forum since 2009, for mutual support and reflection on their work. Many employers of peer/consumer workers have understood the benefits gained through peer workers meeting for reflection and mutual support and have generously encouraged and supported their employees to attend meetings during work time.

In recognition of the benefits that come from a workforce acting in solidarity, this forum provided the context out of which grew a commitment to the formation of a professional association whose membership would be open to people working in the mental health sector, who have a lived experience of mental ill health and recovery, and who declare and use that experience as part of their employment.

This initiative has been supported by the peak body for consumers in Victoria, the Victorian Mental Illness Awareness Council (VMIAC). Support for the creation of this
